Peer-to-Peer Resources Shared in Post-Webinar Discussion Group Session

- Contact Tracing, Data
 - On July 10th, 3:00-4:00 pm EDT, the National Indian Health Board is hosting a <u>webinar on contact</u> tracing in Indian Country. Case investigation and contact tracing are core methods used by Tribal, local, and state health departments for disease control and is a key strategy in preventing the spread of COVID-19.
 - The Center for American Indian Health at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health is working with tribal public health departments and the Indian Health Service on the Navajo Nation and other tribes to support <u>COVID-19 surveillance and contact tracing</u>.
 - The APM Research Lab has independently compiled death statistics, resulting in an up-to-date portrait of <u>COVID-19 mortality by race, with a lens on inequitable deaths</u>.

• Support to Tribal Communities

- The <u>Official Navajo Nation COVID-19 Relief Fund</u> has been established to help the Navajo Nation respond to the pandemic, and address immediate medical and community needs.
- <u>The 2.5 GHz Rural Tribal Window</u> is a unique opportunity for Tribes in rural areas to deploy broadband access over their lands. The 2.5 GHz band is suitable for mobile coverage. The deadline for federally recognized Tribes or Alaska Native Villages to apply for this Federal Communications Commission opportunity is *August 3, 2020*.
- Healing
 - For Decades the U.S. Punished Indigenous Healers. Now the Indian Health Service Wants to Hire <u>Them</u> is a blog that was posted on May 27, 2020 on the Rural America, In These Times site.
 - The book, <u>Metamorphosis of Trauma</u>, establishes foundational tenets from the Lakota culture and features alternative perspectives that contribute to the explanation of primary trauma, as well as approaches to combat its deleterious impact.
